The wearing of school uniform is not governed by legislation but our policy has been adopted by the Board of Governors.

### **Aims of the policy**

- To instil pride in our children through the wearing of their school uniform.
- To encourage the children's identity with and support for our school ethos.
- To protect our children from social pressures to dress in a particular way.
- To nurture cohesion and promote good relations between different groups of pupils.
- To ensure children of all races and backgrounds feel welcome.
- To support positive behaviour and discipline and in turn support effective teaching and learning

As part of our ethos we would like all children to wear the correct uniform properly at all times. This includes to and from school, the playground, corridors and classrooms.

It is important for the promotion of social independence that the younger children are able to manage their own clothes and shoes. This should be considered when purchasing school uniform. We therefore encourage velcro fastening trainers/shoes in Foundation and Key Stage 1.

In order to return lost property, all uniform and personal items should be clearly marked, with a permanent marker or label, with the child's name.

## **School Uniform**

### **Girls**

**Pale blue school polo shirt** (This does not have to display school logo – plain polo shirts can be purchased in a variety of stores including Asda, Dunnes, Tesco. Polo shirts including school logo can be purchased in S&K Shoes Castlederg)

**Grey school sweatshirt** (This can be purchased in S&K Shoes Castlederg)

**Grey skirt/trousers/pinafore** (These items can be purchased in a variety of stores including Asda, Dunnes, Marks & Spencers, Tesco)

### **Boys**

**Pale blue school polo shirt** (This does not have to display school logo – plain polo shirts can be purchased in a variety of stores including Asda, Dunnes, Tesco. Polo shirts including school logo can be purchased in S&K Shoes Castlederg)

**Grey school sweatshirt** (This can be purchased in S&K Shoes Castlederg)

**Grey trousers** (Trousers can be purchased in a variety of stores including Asda, Dunnes, Marks & Spencers, Tesco)

**Footwear** – comfortable and practical footwear

In the Summer, if weather is hot, children are permitted to wear shorts to school. Girls can also choose to wear the light blue gingham dress.

## **P.E Uniform**

Children should wear indoor trainers, navy shorts/tracksuit bottoms/leggings into school on P.E days. Long hair needs to be tied back for P.E lessons.

Children will wear their blue school polo shirt during P.E lessons.

## **Eco Uniform shop**

Please note that Killen Primary School operates an eco uniform shop. This consists of a variety of school uniform items which have been handed in to the school to recycle. These are available to purchase at a small cost.

## **Jewellery**

- We would encourage children not to wear jewellery to school.
- Necklaces should not be worn over the top of uniforms.
- We would encourage those children with ear piercings to wear plain studs in the interests of their health and safety.

Please note that the school will be unable to take any responsibility for jewellery that is lost or broken.

No make-up or false nails should be worn by pupils at primary school.
